Mayor Whitlow and Trustee Brodhead have previously earned the Graduate Level Award.

CML's MUNIversity program is designed to recognize municipal elected officials who participate in educational events to increase their knowledge of government and enhance their capacity to lead. Educational sessions of interest at this year's conference include strategic planning, service continuity, affordable housing, legislative impacts, and water/wastewater infrastructure.
