

LETTER TO THE COMMUNITY

Dear Mead residents.

We are pleased to share the 2021-2022 Mead Community Report with you. In it, you will find an abundance of information about what we were able to accomplish with your help in 2021, what the Town of Mead's goals are for 2022, as well as an overview of the town's budget and finances. Last year was a busy and productive one for the Town of Mead, even in the face of the ongoing pandemic that presented challenges for all of us.

We want to begin with a big thank you to voters who passed a 1% sales and use tax increase to create a Street Improvement Fund that will, over time, address what we all know to be a challenging issue for the Town of Mead: the declining condition of our streets. Thanks to this new, dedicated revenue stream for street maintenance and improvement, we anticipate raising more than \$2.2 million in 2022 – largely from visitors or those passing through Mead – that will go solely to fixing and improving our streets.

In 2022, we are moving forward with finalizing the Bean Plant Community Center design, bringing us one step closer to offering a community gathering place in Old Town Mead. Thanks to all of you for your input on this project in 2021! We will also complete intersection improvements at 3rd Street and Welker, improving public safety and the flow of traffic through town.





PROPERTY TAX AND MILL RATES

Property tax is based on the property's assessed value; Weld County assesses property values at least every two years. The Town of Mead's mill levy is 11.52, and the average net mill levy for a non-metro district property is 104.74.



2021 HIGHLIGHTS



Ziggi's Coffee completed construction of its new world headquarters in Old Town Mead in 2021. The Mead Urban Renewal Authority, established in 2016 to help blighted areas of Mead, assisted Ziggi's with the cost of public improvements for the project.



ADDITIONAL SUCCESSES:

RELIABLE INFRASTRUCTURE

The 3rd Street Reconstruction project rebuilt the two-lane asphalt road from Weld County Road 34½ to the north Town limits, just north of Willow Drive (south of County Road 38). This project transformed the worst section of road in Mead to a reliable, safe, multimodal thoroughfare.

In 2021, the town invested in body-worn cameras for the Mead Police Department. This equipment allows officers to be accountable to the public, while maintaining their commitment to transparency and community safety.



ADDITIONAL SUCCESSES:

- Hiring Police Commander and 2 officers
- Executed safeguards against cyber threats
- Facility digital locking system



In November, voters approved a 1% sales and use tax increase that is expected to generate approximately \$2.2M in its first year. All revenue from the tax increase is dedicated to the Street Improvement Fund and can only be used for street projects, including maintenance.

In 2021, the town conducted public outreach about recreation and community gathering needs with the goal of transforming the vacant bean plant building into a vibrant recreation and community hub. We are finalizing the preliminary design scope and are committed to a final design plan and phasing options by 2022.

- Designed wayfinding signage to increase economic development and promote community connections
- Increased communication and social media presence
- The Town continued its support of the Mead Area Chamber of Commerce, Mead Motorheads, and a variety of school activities







AWARDS & GRANTS

In addition to property and sales tax paid to the Town of Mead from residents and visitors, the town consistently pursues additional funding sources to contribute to critical projects.



In 2021, the Town of Mead received a number of grants to complete critical infrastructure projects that will better connect our community and protect public safety – while stretching local tax dollars farther. Here is a snapshot of the grants received:

American Rescue Plan Act — \$1.189.135.69
