## **Highlights of 2020**



The Sorrento and The Highlands residential developments added over 200 new homes to Mead. Through Impact Fees, new development pays for all or a portion of the costs to provide public services to the development.


In July of 2020, the Mead Board of Trustees voted unanimously to move \$2.1 million from general fund reserves to the capital improvement fund to complete the total reconstruction of 3rd Street from WCR 34.5 to WCR 36. The 3rd Street Reconstruction Project is slated to beginning in 2021.





In 2020, the Mead Police Department fully transitioned to 24/7 independent coverage. They implemented first line supervisors (2 Sergeants) and added a second School Resource Officer that was fully funded by St. Vrain School District.

The Town of Mead received grant funding for Highland Lake Improvements, Phase 1. The grant will help cover costs to build a floating pier and boat ramp. Construction is expected to start in early 2021.





The Town of Mead unveiled its updated website in October of 2020. The website is ADA compliant and includes easier navigation and improved community connection.

## 2021 Budget Summary

The Town of Mead's budget reflects the goals and priorities developed by the Board of Trustees. The budget not only serves as a financial plan, but a blueprint for town services in the immediate year as well as a tool for long-term planning. The 2021 budget was adopted on December 14, 2020.

#### **Responsible Growth**

Expanding public safety and court services, including providing 24 hour police coverage and body worn cameras.

#### **Connected Community**

Implementing additional communication, building relationships and improving transparency between town and residents by enhancing our outreach and partnering with local businesses.





A significant portion of the town's services are funded by revenue collected from sales tax. At 2%, Mead has the lowest sales tax among its peers, generating only \$2.69M annually.

### **RESIDENTIAL IMPACT FEES WITHIN 15 MILES OF MEAD**

A one-time fee imposed by the town on new development projects to pay for all or a portion of the costs of providing public services to the new development.

These fees help to reduce the economic burden of area growth.
