

ORDINANCE NO. 4

RUNNING AT LARGE OF DOMESTIC ANIMALS

Be it ordained by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Mead, Colorado:

Section: That it shall be unlawful for horses, asses, mules, cattle, sheep, swine and goats, or either of them, to run at large within the corporate limits of the Town of Mead.

Section II. Any person being the owner, or having possession, custody or control of any animal, who permits or suffers the same to run at large contrary to section one of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof be fined not less than one dollar, nor more than twenty-five dollars, for each and every offense, and costs to be recovered in accordance with the provisions of the statutes in such cases made and provided.

Section III. It shall be the duty of the town marshal to see to the enforcement of this ordinance, and he shall take up any animal found running at large contrary to the provisions of this ordinance and impound the same, and proceed as provided by statute in such cases made and provided.
