

ORDINANCE NO. 66

AN ORDINANCE PERTAINING TO THE TAPPING OF WATER MAINS, INSTALLATION OF MATERIALS INCIDENT THERETO, PLANT INVESTMENT FEE, AND WATER RESOURCE FEE;

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF MEAD, COUNTY OF WELD, STATE OF COLORADO:

Section 1. Tapping Water Mains, Plant Investment Fee, and Water Resource Fee. Ordinance No. 49, Section 1, and all subsequent amendments thereto, of the Code of the Town of Mead are hereby amended to read as follows:

There is hereby imposed a uniform plant investment, water resource, and water main tapping charge, payable upon application for a water tap in the Town of Mead, as follows:

<u>Meter Size</u>	<u>Location</u>	<u>Use</u>	<u>Fee</u>
3/4"	Within corporate limits	Residential	\$1,500.00
3/4"	Within corporate limits	Other than residential	\$1,800.00
3/4"	Outside corporate limits	Any	\$2,500.00

Taps requiring a larger meter shall be subject to negotiation between the applicant and the Town of Mead, and such taps must be approved on an individual basis by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Mead.

Section 2. Repeal of Inconsistent Ordinances. All ordinances, resolutions and motions of the Board of Trustees of the Town of Mead, or part thereof, in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance, are to the extent of such conflict hereby superseded and repealed.

Section 3. Severability. The sections of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable and if any section, provision, or part thereof shall be held unconstitutional or invalid, the remainder of this Ordinance shall continue in full force and effect, it being the legislative intent that this Ordinance would have been adopted even if such unconstitutional or invalid matter had not been included therein. It is further declared that if any provision or part of this section, or the application thereof to any person or circumstances, is held invalid, the remainder of this Ordinance and the application thereof to other persons shall not be affected thereby.

In the opinion of the Board of Trustees of the Town of Mead, Weld County, Colorado, this Ordinance is necessary for the immediate protection and preservation of the public health, safety, convenience, and general welfare, and it is enacted for that purpose and shall be in full force and effect FIVE (5) days after passage and final publication.
