

ORDINANCE NO. 67

AN ORDINANCE PERTAINING TO THE WATER RATES FOR USERS OF THE TOWN OF MEAD WATER SYSTEM.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF MEAD, COUNTY OF WELD, STATE OF COLORADO:

Section 1. Water Rates. Ordinance No. 41, Section 1, and Ordinance No. 53 of the Code of the Town of Mead is hereby amended to read as follows:

There shall be assessed and charged for the use of water measured through a meter, per month, from any of the water mains or water system of the Town of Mead, rates and rentals as hereinafter set forth:

(a.) For water users inside the Town limits of the Town of Mead there shall be charged:

For the first 10,000 gallons.....\$13.00
For all over 10,000 gallons.....\$.80 per every
1,000
gallons

(b.) For water users outside the Town limits of the Town of Mead with the exception of the Mead Elementary School and Mead Junior High School there shall be charged:

For the first 10,000 gallons.....\$ 19.50
For all over 10,000 gallons.....\$.80^f per every
1,000
gallons

(c.) For the Mead Junior High School and Mead Elementary School there shall be charged:

\$1.00 per thousand gallons, with a minimum monthly charge of \$470.00.

(d.) The rates with respect to water usage shall take effect on June 1, 1977.

Section 2. Repeal of Inconsistent Ordinances. All Ordinances, Resolutions, and Motions of the Board of Trustees of the Town of Mead or parts thereof, in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance, are to the extent of such conflict hereby superseded and repealed.

Section 3. Severability. The Sections of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable, and if any Section, provision, or part thereof shall be held unconstitutional or invalid, the remainder of this Ordinance shall continue in full force and effect, it being the legislative intent that this Ordinance would have been adopted even if such unconstitutional or invalid matter had not been included therein. It is further declared that if any provision or part of this Section, or the application thereof to any person or circumstances, is held invalid, the remainder

of this Ordinance and the application thereof to other persons shall not be affected thereby.

In the opinion of the Board of Trustees of the Town of Mead, Weld County, Colorado, this Ordinance is necessary for the immediate protection and preservation of the public health, safety, convenience, and general welfare, and it is enacted for that purpose and shall be in full force and effect FIVE (5) days after passage and final publication.
