

ORDINANCE NO. 75

AN ORDINANCE RELATIVE TO THE REGULATION AND LICENSING OF DOGS, AMENDING ALL ORDINANCES AND SECTIONS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT THEREWITH, AND SPECIFICALLY AMENDING ORDINANCE 38, SECTION 10, OF THE TOWN OF MEAD.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF MEAD, WELD COUNTY, COLORADO:

Section 1. Section 10, of Ordinance No. 38 of the Town of Mead is hereby repealed and is re-enacted to read as follows:

Section 10. Redemption of Dogs. Any owner, custodian, or keeper of a dog desiring to redeem such dog from the Town of Mead pound shall pay to the Town the following redemption fee:

- a) For the first TWENTY-FOUR (24) hour period or any portion thereof: \$20.00
- b) For each TWENTY-FOUR (24) hour period or portion thereof after the initial TWENTY-FOUR (24) hour period: \$5.00

In addition, if such dog is unlicensed, the owner, custodian, or keeper must license said dog pursuant to this ordinance prior to its release. If such dog is licensed but the license tag has been lost, said license tag must be replaced prior to the release of the dog.

Section 2. All Ordinances, Resolutions, and Motions of the Board of Trustees of the Town of Mead or parts thereof, in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance, are to the extent of such conflict hereby superseded and repealed.

Section 3. The Sections of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable, and if any section, provisions, or part thereof shall be held unconstitutional or invalid, the remainder of this Ordinance shall continue in full force and effect, it being the legislative intent that this Ordinance would have been adopted even if such unconstitutional or invalid matter had not been included therein. It is further declared that if any provision or part of this Ordinance, or the application thereof to any person or circumstances, is held invalid, the remainder of this Ordinance and the application thereof to other persons shall not be effected thereby.

In the opinion of the Board of Trustees of the Town of Mead, Weld County, Colorado, this Ordinance is necessary for the immediate protection and preservation of public health, safety, convenience, and general welfare, and it is enacted for that purpose and shall be in full force and effect after passage and final publication.
