TOWN OF MEAD, COLORADO RESOLUTION NO. 10-R-2005

A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN OF MEAD, COLORADO, ADOPTING A POLICY FOR THE INSTALLATION OF STREETLIGHTS IN RESIDENTIAL AREAS.

WHEREAS, it is a desire of the Board of Trustees to establish a consistent policy with regard to be type and style of streetlights installed in developing portions of the Town; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Board of Trustees, in so far as practical, to prevent unnecessary light pollution within the Town.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Mead, Weld County, Colorado, that:

- Section 1. The Town of Mead wishes to preserve and create a rural feel to the community and to prevent unnecessary light pollution insofar as possible by limiting the amount of an manner in which light fixtures are installed. To this end, relative to street lighting, it will require that all such lights must use downcast, cut-off fixtures. In addition, street lighting will be limited to one light per intersection at all intersections and at key identified safety locations, such as blind spots or occurs with greater than 45-degree deflection. The height of polls, wattage and type of light source, and other specific design issues of pertinent to the standards will be determined on a case-by-case basis.
- Section 2. Effective Date. This resolution shall become effective immediately upon adoption.
- Section 3. Repealer. All resolutions, or parts thereof, in conflict with this resolution are hereby repealed, provided that such repealer shall not repeal the repealer clauses of such resolution nor revive any resolution thereby.
- Section 4. Certification. The Town Clerk shall certify to the passage of this resolution and make not less than one copy of the adopted resolution available for inspection by the public during regular business hours.
