RESOLUTION NO. 18-R-2000

A RESOLUTION LEVYING TAXES FOR THE YEAR 2001 TO DEFRAY THE COSTS OF MUNICIPAL GOVERNMENT OF MEAD, COLORADO, FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 2001, AND ENDING DECEMBER 31, 2001, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of the Town of Mead, has adopted the annual budget for the fiscal year beginning January 1, 2001, and ending December 31, 2001, in accordance with the Local Government Budget Law, on December 11, 2000; and

WHEREAS, the amount of money necessary to balance the budget for general operating expenses is \$288,802; and

WHEREAS, the amount of money necessary to balance the budget for bonds and interest is \$12,250; and

WHEREAS, the 2000 valuation for assessment for the Town of Mead as certified by the County Assessor is \$22,377,570; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees is required by C.R.S. 39-5-128, to certify the mill levy to the Weld County Board of County Commissioners not later than December 15, 2000.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF MEAD, COLORADO:

Section 1. That for the purposes of meeting all general operating expenses of Mead, Colorado, during the fiscal year beginning January 1, 2001, and ending December 31, 2001, there is hereby levied a tax of 12,906 mills upon each dollar of the total assessed valuation of all taxable property within the Town of Mead for the fiscal year 2001.

Section 2. That for the purpose of meeting all bonds and interest expenses of the Town of Mead, Colorado, during the fiscal year beginning January 1, 2001, and ending December 31, 2001, there is hereby levied a tax of 0.554 mills upon each dollar of the total assessed valuation of all property within the Town of Mead for the year 2001.

Section 3. That the Town Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to immediately certify to the County Commissioners of Weld County, Colorado, the total tax levy for the Town of Mead, Colorado, as is herein set forth.

Section 4. In the opinion of the Board of Trustees of the Town of Mead, Weld County, Colorado, this Resolution is necessary for the immediate protection and preservation of the public health, safety, convenience, and general welfare, and it is enacted for that purpose and shall be in full force and effect after passage and publication.
